Introduction

Background Information

Ilembula Institute of Health and Allied Sciences is a faith-based health training institution owned by ELCT-SD. The institute started as Ilembula Nurses and Midwives Training School (INMTS) in 1963. In May 2002, the school's name was transformed to Ilembula School of Nursing and Midwifery after being registered by the National Council for Technical Education (NACTE) with a status of full registration. In September 2003, the school started offering diploma courses in the same program and the first intake graduated in 2007.

The school was accredited in November 2014 following the transformation of its name from Ilembula school of Nursing and Midwifery to Ilembula Institute of Health and Allied Sciences. Changing the name from Ilembula School of Nursing and Midwifery to IIHAS allowed the Institute to add other health training programs.

Recognition of CMD at IIHAS:

Clinical Medicine Department was recognized in 2018 by the NACTE following an application from IIHAS to recognize the department.

Registration status

The institute is fully accredited by NACTE following reaffirmation accreditation held in 2020.

Geographical Location

IIHAS is located in Sothern Highland Zone, Njombe region, Wanging'ombe district at Ilembula ward within premises of Ilembula Lutheran Hospital. It is situated 735 KM from Dar es salaam City. The institute is nearest to the international road Dar es Salaam to Lusaka Zambia 5KM from the Halali- Ilembula junction.

IIHAS GOVERNING AND ADMINISTRATION

Admission Regulation

The following are admission regulations to a successful selected applicant at IIHAS

- i. A successful selected applicant shall be registered only after have paid the requisite Institute fees and provided evidence of payment receipt from IIHAS bursar.
- ii. Each student shall have to join or show evidence that they are members of National Health Insurance Fund or other similar fund at the time of registration.
- iii. Fees paid will not be refunded, except under exceptional circumstances as determined by the Institute Management. All admitted students are expected to conform entirely to IIHAS regulations.
- iv. All new students are required to report for the orientation programme that normally takes place during the week preceding the beginning of the new academic year.
- v. The deadline for registration of NTA level 4 students shall be as per schedule of NACTVET No student shall be allowed to join the Institute after closure of admission window.
- vi. Except in exceptional circumstances, no student will be allowed to change the study programme later than the time scheduled by NACTVET after the beginning of the first semester.
- vii. A student who freeze studies will be allowed to be away from studies for a maximum of two years if he/she is to be re- admitted to the same year of studies where they left off.
- viii. Students discontinued from studies on academic grounds from the Institute shall only be eligible for re-admission for the same or any other programmes when next offered.
- ix. Students discontinued from studies on professional misconduct or disciplinary grounds or due to examination irregularity shall not be re- admitted to this Institute.
- x. No student will be allowed to postpone or freeze studies after effective commencement of an academic year except under very special circumstances. Permission to postpone or freeze studies will be considered after producing satisfactory evidence of the reasons for postponement or freezing and written approval from the parent/guardian/sponsor.
 - Special circumstances shall include:
 - a) Sickness.
 - b) Family/Social problems (each case to be considered on its own merit)
 - c) (c) Severe sponsorship problem or employer withdrawal of permission

Registration Requirements for all Programmes

- a) A candidate shall be registered for diploma in Nursing and Midwifery upon presenting proof of possession of the entry qualifications.
- b) The deadline for registration for those selected shall be as scheduled by NACTVET.
- c) For those selected during the second selection the deadline shall be on the Friday of the fourth week after the commencement of the programme in that academic year.
- d) No candidate shall be registered prior to payment of fees and other dues payable to the Institute

Bursaries and Fees

- a) All payments i.e tuition fee and other contributions shall be paid as per institute schedule
- b) All payments shall be done via Institute bank accounts except to special circumstances as will be directed by Bursar office.
- c) Make sure that you obtain payment receipt from Bursars office after payment
- d) No money shall be refunded to the students once paid to the institute following postponement, transfer from one institute to another, discontinuation from studies of any kind or personal decision of terminating studies.

The Institute Library

The IIHAS Library is the major collection of health/medical resource. Its main function is to provide library and documentation services to support health/medical services, research, teaching and consultancy at the Institute and Ilembula Lutheran Hospital. However, the Library also serves other users from outside the two Ilembula institutions on request. The IIHAS Library has four main divisions: Technical Services (Cataloguing and Classification);

Reader services (Reference, Circulation, Information Desk and Special Reserve); Periodicals and Documentation; and ICT services. The collection mainly comprises of books and periodicals in medicine and health. The Library has a rich collection of health and medical information materials, including government and research publications. It also includes electronic information resources, off-line resources, and e-resources and Internet facilities.

The broad areas covered include Medicine, Nursing, Public Health and Basic Sciences. Social Sciences and Humanities are also covered, to a lesser extent.

Examination Regulations

- i. A candidate shall be allowed to sit for end of semester examination only if attends at least 90% of class and practical sessions.
- ii. A candidate who fails to attend for 90% of class and practical attendance shall be required to repeat the module(s)
- iii. A candidate shall be allowed to sit for end of semester examination after been assigned examination number
- iv. A candidate shall be allowed to sit for end of semester examination only if have performed procedures as stipulated in procedure book as indicated in the respective curricula.
- v. A candidate shall not be allowed to enter in the examination room after a lapse of 30 minutes of the examination from the commencement of the examination.
- vi. A candidate shall not be allowed to leave examination room in the first and last 30 minutes unless circumstance dictate otherwise.
- vii. A candidate shall not be allowed to smuggle in any authorized material or communicate with other candidates in the examination venue.
- viii. A candidate shall have completed field work/projects as stipulated in the respective curricula
- ix. End of semester examinations results must be released within three weeks from the date of completion of examination.
- x. Each module taught in a semester will be examined separately at the end of semester.
- xi. A candidate will be eligible for the end of semester examination if has successfully passed continuous assessments for each module.
- xii. A candidate who fails to attain 50% of continuous assessment for each module shall not be allowed to sit for end of semester examination.
- xiii. A candidate who fails to attain 50% of continuous assessment shall be required to repeat the failed respective module(s)
- xiv. A candidate who did not sit for the end of semester examination for any module due to acceptable reason(s), shall have to do the examination for that module before progressing towards next semester.
- xv. A candidate who attains GPA of 2.0 or above should be allowed to supplement the failed module not later than four weeks after released of results.
- xvi. A candidate who fails a supplementary module should be allowed to repeat the failed module(s)
- xvii. A candidate who fails half of the total modules examined during first sit should repeat the respective modules failed
- xviii. A candidate who fails after repeating a module(s) should be discontinued form study programme
- xix. A candidate who fails end of semester examination with GPA less than 2.0 should be discontinued from the programme.

- xx. A candidate who fails two supplementary examinations for any module shall be discontinued from studies.
- xxi. A candidate who falls seriously sick just before or during end of semester examinations or is hospitalised will be allowed to sit the examinations when condition has stabilized; when next offered.
- xxii. A candidate who feels unable to attempt end of semester examination for any module for genuine reason, should present his/her case in writing four weeks before the date of end of semester examination to the Examination Committee of an institution for consideration.
- xxiii. A candidate will be deemed to have passed the end of semester examination if has achieved a minimum of 50% of the set marks for both theory and practical examination for each module.
